LESSON PLAN

Day One: Physical Traits

Objective: The students will be able to describe the physical characteristics of an Emperor Penguin.

LESSON PLAN: DAY ONE

Introduction (5 minutes):

- *Tell students that this week we will be learning all about Emperor Penguins. Ask students to share what they already know about Emperor Penguins and what they would like to learn.
- *Explain that Emperor Penguins are unique because they are birds, but they can't fly. They are also the largest penguins.

Lesson (15 minutes):


- *Read "Emperor Penguins" by Roberta Edwards. Questions to ask - What do you notice about what Emperor Penguins look like? Why can't they fly like other birds? Why do Emperor Penguins waddle? What makes a penguin a bird?
- *Use information from the read aloud as a class to fill in the activity sheet attached below "Emperor Penguins can, have, are".
- *Fill in the activity sheet attached below on the parts of a penguin.

Independent Work (10 minutes)


*Students will independently fill in the "Are Penguins Birds?" activity sheet.

Closing (5 minutes)

*Review "Are Penguins Birds" activity sheet. Discuss that penguins are in fact birds. They have feathers, are warm-blooded, lay eggs, have wings, are vertebrates and have feathers.

ESSON PLAN

Day Two: Habitat

Objective: The students will be able to describe the habitat where Emperor Penguins live.



Introduction (10 minutes):


- *Tell students that today they will be learning about an Emperor Penguin's habitat. Ask students what they noticed about their habitat from the previous lesson.
- *Show students attached graphic sheet below. Explain that Emperor Penguins primarily live in Antarctica in very cold, icy habitats. They live in large groups called colonies.

Lesson (20 minutes):

- *Show Emperor Penguin video to students. Tell students to observe characteristics of their habitat - https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=W5ddwHJqyj8
- *Review with students main idea and key details. Explain that main idea is what something is mostly about. Ask students what they think the main idea of the video was. Key details include important information that help us understand more about the main idea.
- *Explain to students that because Emperor Penguin's habitats are so cold, they've developed ways to keep warm like huddling together in groups, their thick feathers, and an extra layer of fat called blubber.
- *Complete the three key details on the attached activity sheet below with students.

Independent Work (10 minutes)

*Students will independently complete the "Vocabulary Match Up" activity sheet attached. Review together when finished.

Day Three: Diet ective: The student

Objective: The students will be able to identify what penguins eat.



LESSON PLAN: DAY THREE

Introduction (10 minutes):

- *Tell students that today's lesson will be "diving deeper" into what Emperor Penguins eat! Get it? Diving deeper? Explain that Emperor Penguins primarily dive into the arctic waters to catch their prey.
- *Show attached sheet below and explain that Emperor Penguins eat krill, squid, and fish (primarily Antarctic Silverfish). Tell students that they also have two main predators - orcas and leopard seals.

Lesson (15 minutes):

*Answer comprehension questions on the "A Penguin's Diet" activity sheet with students.

Independent Work (15 minutes)

*Use the "Penguin Story" activity sheet attached below. Explain to students they will come up with a creative story using the words that are in the box.


Closing (5 minutes)



LESSON PLAN

Day Four: Life Cycle
Objective: The students will be able
to recognize the stages of a
penguin's life cycle and describe
each stage.



Introduction (10 minutes):

*Tell students that they will be exploring more about the life cycle of an Emperor Penguin. Explain that life cycles are the stages an animal goes through as it grows.

*The teacher will read "The Emperor's Egg" by Martin Jenkins. Questions to ask while reading - Who do you notice takes care of the egg? Why & how do the dad penguins take care of the egg? Do the penguins eat while taking care of the egg? If so, what? Why do they live in such a

cold habitat?


Lesson (20 minutes):

- *The students will complete the "Life Cycle of a Penguin" activity sheet attached below. Use the words at the bottom of the page to fill in each stage.
- *Then, write one to two sentences on the activity sheet below describing each stage of the Emperor Penguin life cycle.
- *Thumbs Up, Thumbs Down Game: Read a statement about the life cycle of a penguin. Tell students to put a thumbs up if it is true, or thumbs down if it is false.

Independent Work (15 minutes)

*Students will independently complete the "Fact or Fiction?" activity sheet attached below. Discuss as a class when completed.

Day Five: Behaviors
Objective: The students will be able
to identify unique behaviors of
penguins including huddling, living in
colonies, egg care, waddling, diving for
food, etc.



LESSON PLAN: DAY FIVE

Introduction (10 minutes):

- *Explain to students that they will be reviewing the unique behaviors of Emperor Penguins that they learned through out the week.
- *Ask students to name behaviors of penguins that they noticed. Example huddling together, waddling, the way they take care of their eggs, living in colonies, etc.
- *Make an anchor chart or list on the white board listing the unique behaviors of Emperor Penguins.

Lesson (15 minutes):

*Use the "Behaviors of Emperor Penguins" activity brainstorm sheet below. Write four behaviors and describe as a class.

Act Like A Penguin Game! The teacher will call out a certain behavior of penguins (waddling, huddling, diving, etc.) and students will act out the behavior.

*Students will answer the "Act Like A Penguin" comprehension question worksheet attached below.


Independent Work (10 minutes)

*Students will independently complete "Penguin Behavior Unscramble". The words are all associated with behaviors of Emperor Penguins. Answer Key is attached.

Closing (5 minutes)

*Give students a sticky note. Have them write the most interesting thing they learned about penguins throughout the unit. Share notes with the class.
